PLANS FORTHE SOLAR ECLIPSE? CHECK OUT WHAT'S HAPPENING AROUND SHELBY COUNTY!

A total solar eclipse is a rare and spectacular event. On average, one happens somewhere on the Earth once every 1.5 years but only 21 solar eclipses have crossed the lower 48 in the history of the United States. The last total solar eclipse visible in Ohio was in 1806. The next total solar eclipse will not be visible in Ohio until the year 2099.

The "path of totality" during a solar eclipse is the path that the moon's shadow falls onto the Earth's surface. On **April 8, 2024**, the centerline for the path of totality will dissect Shelby County entering in the vicinity of Fort Loram-

ie and exiting near Botkins. To witness the 2024 solar eclipse in all its splendor, viewing along the path of totality is optimal. Outside of the path of totality, one will only see a partial eclipse

HOW TO MAKE JOY A PRIORITY IN THE WORKPLACE

Joy is not a word that is often associated with work. Many people view work as a source of stress, frustration, or boredom. However, work can also be a source of happiness, fulfillment, and meaning. According to a study by Oxford University, happy workers are up to 13% more productive than unhappy workers. The study tracked 1,800 workers and their feelings of happiness over a series of weeks. Moreover, happy employees are more likely to stay longer, perform better, and contribute more to their organizations.

So how can we make joy a priority in the workplace? How can we create a culture that fosters joy and reduces the "joy gap" that many workers experience? According to a survey by A.T. Kearney, nearly 90% of workers expect to experience a substantial degree of joy at work, but only 37% actually do. This gap is not only detrimental to individual well-being, but also to organizational performance and innovation.

Let's explore some of the ways leaders can close the joy gap and bring more joy to the workplace. We will also share some examples of companies that have successfully implemented joy-enhancing practices and policies.

I. Foster a culture centered on building relationships and community—One of the most important factors that influence joy at work is the quality of relationships that workers have with their colleagues, managers, and customers. Relationships provide support, feedback, recognition, and belonging. They also enable collaboration, creativity, and learning. Therefore, leaders should foster a culture that values and nurtures relationships and community.

Some of the ways to do this are:

- * Encourage frequent & meaningful communication among team members & across departments.
- * Provide opportunities for social interaction & fun activities that build rapport & trust.
- * Recognize & celebrate achievements, milestones, & birthdays,
- * Create a feedback-rich environment where workers can give/receive constructive criticism & praise.
- * Promote diversity & inclusion by respecting & appreciating different perspectives & backgrounds.
- 2. Ensure employees understand the goals of the company and their role in achieving them—Another key factor that influences joy at work is the sense of purpose and alignment that workers have with their work. When workers understand how their work contributes to the larger

Still further, our Foundation continued its three-year pledges of support for the Workforce Partnership of Shelby County and the Wallace Family Learning and Innovation Center with operating grant funding over and above the specific school and project funding noted above.

Thank you, members, for believing as we do in the importance of education. Without question, we are making a difference.

- * Recognize & reward employees for social impact efforts.

- 3. Chamber member organization will provide 575 copies of the approved flyer to the Chamber office no later than the 15th of the month prior to the scheduled mail date (i.e., for April's mailing, inserts needed by March 15.

- 8 1/2 x 11 single-folded or tri-folded to fit into a 6 x 9 envelope (information facing outward)
- 24# paper weight or less
- Type written
- Must be pre-approved by Chamber Vice President
- May not in any way refer to or damage the business reputation of a fellow Chamber member.
